The densification should occur nearby all transport routes and infrastructure. So the answer is both yes and no.

For example provide a fast rail on the existing rail network to Nambour and Gympie and this enhances options for new housing in the exisitng railway towns, noting that this is not about green field development but enable the current urban footprint and logical in fill. Most people who come to the region want to live in the coastal corridor which is the reason that all the services and main public tranpsort networks are in the coastal enterprise corridor as per the planning scheme.

In well planned centres people live where the services are and it is easy to move around. If people live a distance from services then this results in more car journeys and congestion.
